2022 was a pivotal and transitional year for KidLinks as we returned fully to in-person services in our therapeutic music entertainment (TME) and music therapy (MT) programs. Our commitment to championing healing, hope, and happiness for children and families remained steadfast and strong. We grew our MT clinic locations to provide more therapy access for kids across North Texas, developed new partnerships, and focused our efforts on providing



MEET OUR NEWEST THERAPEUTIC MUSIC ENTERTAINERS!

In 2022, we welcomed two new Therapeutic Music Entertainers, Andy Sperandeo and Jasmyne Marshall to the team! Andy is accomplished in jazz, classical, rock, pop, and r&b, as well as other styles of music. He performs regularly with several jazz groups, along with a classical string ensemble, and original groups around the DFW area. In addition to his expansive background as a performer, Andy has also written, arranged, produced, and recorded for a variety of artists over the years. Jasmyne is an experienced music therapist who takes pride in providing quality music therapy services to populations with limited voices. She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Music Therapy from TWU and assisted in growing an exemplary music therapy internship program at VNA Texas Hospice and Palliative Care. She's currently completing her counseling and pre-med studies and also works with several other nonprofits providing MT services to children migrating to the United States and in the foster care system.

MUSIC THERAPY (MT)

At the start of 2022, clients were only seen virtually due to the pandemic. Currently, we have four music therapy clinic locations to offer our music therapy families: two home practices in Arlington and Fort Worth, J.W. Brown Music Therapist-in-Residence program at Southern Methodist University, and Bridges Training Foundation in Midlothian. In addition, we continue to provide telehealth sessions to families who are unable to travel to one of our physical locations. Prior to the pandemic, we only had one clinic location at First United Methodist Church in Hurst. This expansion into other areas of DFW and Ellis County provides added access to families who need free to low-cost music therapy services.

Every week, our four Board-Certified Music Therapists provide essential one-on-one sessions with children with special needs ranging from autism and ADHD to hearing and vision impairments.

MEET OUR NEWEST MUSIC THERAPISTS!

In May 2022, we welcomed a new Music Therapist, Cora Lansdowne! Cora has a Bachelor of Music in Applied Flute from Baylor University and a Masters of

Counties and is also a Certified Music Together Director and Teacher.

Music Education/Music Therapy Endorsement from University of Kansas. A Board-Certified Music Therapist and a long time member of AMTA, Cora has been practicing music therapy for more than 15 years. She manages a private music therapy practice in Ellis and southern Tarrant

We also welcomed Board-Certified Music Therapist, Debbie Dacus, to the team in July 2022. Debbie received her B. S. and M. A. degrees in Music Therapy from TWU. She has served a variety of faculty positions at TWU throughout the years, most recently as Clinical Training

We also celebrated a three-year partnership with Metrocare Services on S-ES resources in 2022. Clinicians and families use customized digital applications—therapeutic music, animations, and guidebooks—in clinical sessions and as part of their client homework assignments. Continual use of the resources have resulted in significant impact on the wellbeing of children in the program.



In July 2022, KidLinks welcomed an additional partner, My Health My

Resources of Tarrant County, a local governmental entity and community mental health and intellectual and developmental disability center.



CNM Certified

Since 2020, we have utilized CNM-Pact to analyze impact trends and direct programming goals and outreach strategies and to support grant submissions. In 2022, we were re-approved for CNM certification which demonstrates our commitment to employing an effective methodology for collecting, analyzing, and reporting program outcomes, making data-driven decisions, improving program performance, and engaging stakeholders in impactful ways.

As a CNM-Certified nonprofit, KidLinks was invited to be a part of the Communities Foundation of Texas' Resilience Capacity Building Series, a four-hour interactive workshop focused on "Building Lasting Resilience Through Data". The workshop included interactive presentations and hands-on activities, co-led by CNM evaluators and nonprofit leaders. KidLinks' Co-Executive Director, Leigh Trevino, co-led a session on "Pursuing Useful Data" and presented key findings from KidLinks' own evaluation practices, significance of having a logic model, building stakeholder diversity, and choosing the right indicators (ex. interesting metrics vs. actionable metrics) to strengthen programs and the organization overall.

2023 KIDLINKS HIGHLIGHTS (JANUARY-JUNE):

With KidLinks' new shared leadership and a dedicated team of staff, music therapists, therapeutic music entertainers, volunteers, partner organizations, and supporters, we are more collaborative, creative, and intentional in the ways we engage and deliver services to North Texas children and youth and their families.

Beginning with a beloved KidLinks classic "I Can Be the Best I Can Be," we are refreshing old songs and writing new songs to further strengthen our library of music and media. In addition, KidLinks has a new partnership with Klyde Warren Park which introduced a new weekly Therapeutic Music and Movement series for children ages 2-6 years old. Thus far, our client capacity grew from 28 to 31 children served per week through our subsidized music therapy program.

In March, we welcomed a new Marketing Communications Specialist, Laura Ingrim, and a new Therapeutic Music Entertainer, Joshua Ingram, to the team! Laura is a graduate of Texas Christian University with a Bachelor's of Music Education, vocal emphasis, and previously taught music for six years on the elementary level in Keller ISD. Joshua is a working singer/songwriter who enjoys an opportunity to bring music to kids, especially in musical service to children with special challenges. From oncology camps to group sessions in hospitals to individual room visits, Joshua offers a unique experience to each listener.





The impact we're making to kids we serve through our TME, MT and S-ES programs is in high demand and gaining recognition in hospitals, schools districts, state and federal institutions, and other organizations that want therapeutic services built from quality, vetted music and media. I believe KidLinks is well-positioned to take on the highly-anticipated increase in demand for these services and we are excited about delivering on the challenges ahead.

Our all-volunteer Energy Golf Classic Tournament Committee, chaired by Patrick Halpin, set a new revenue record for KidLinks and we are tremendously thankful for the quality of the event Patrick, the committee and the Dallas Athletic Club assembled.

Lastly, in 2022 KidLinks worked through the departure of a handful of longtime staff members; most notably was the retirement of our friend and dedicated KidLinks TME, Paul G. Hill, and the resignation of our terrific CEO, Diana Crawford. While it's always challenging to lose talented staff members at these levels, the board and remaining staff members were quite excited to announce the promotion of Leigh Treviño as Co-Executive Director and Director of Programs. Additionally, the KidLinks board approved the hiring of Courtney Kraft to service as Co-Executive Director and Director of Development, and the hiring of Kimberly Ballard-Madison as the new Director of Marketing and Partnerships. 
